

Which version of Excel are compatible with Power Query?

The following Office versions for Windows are supported:

- All versions of Microsoft Office 2016
- All versions of Microsoft Office 2013
- Microsoft Office 2010 Professional Plus with Software Assurance

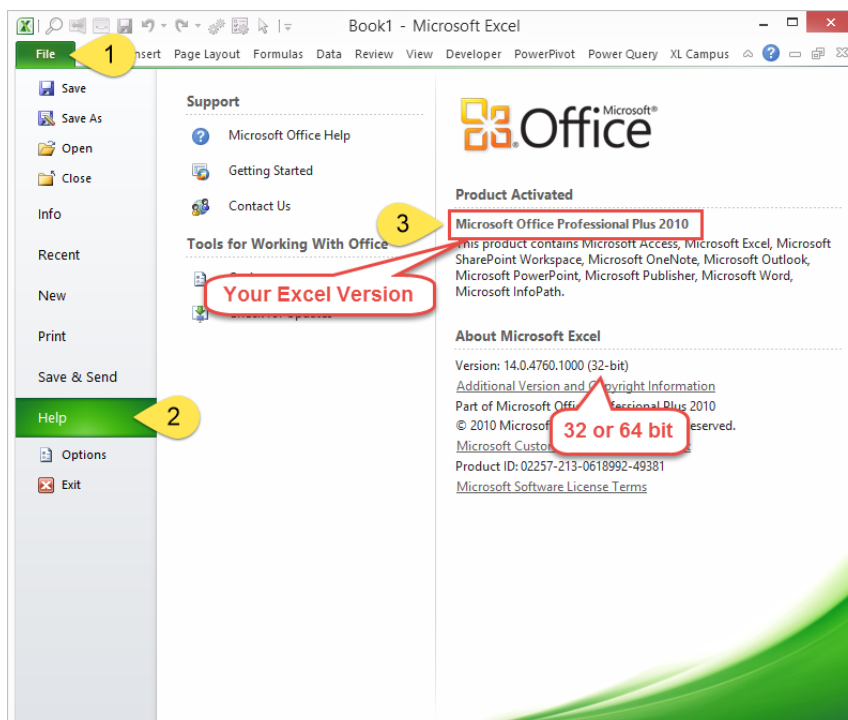
Both 32-bit and 64-bit are supported. Power Query is not compatible with any Mac versions of Excel.

How to Check the Version of Excel?

Excel 2010

Here's how to determine your version and 32 or 64 bits in Excel 2010:

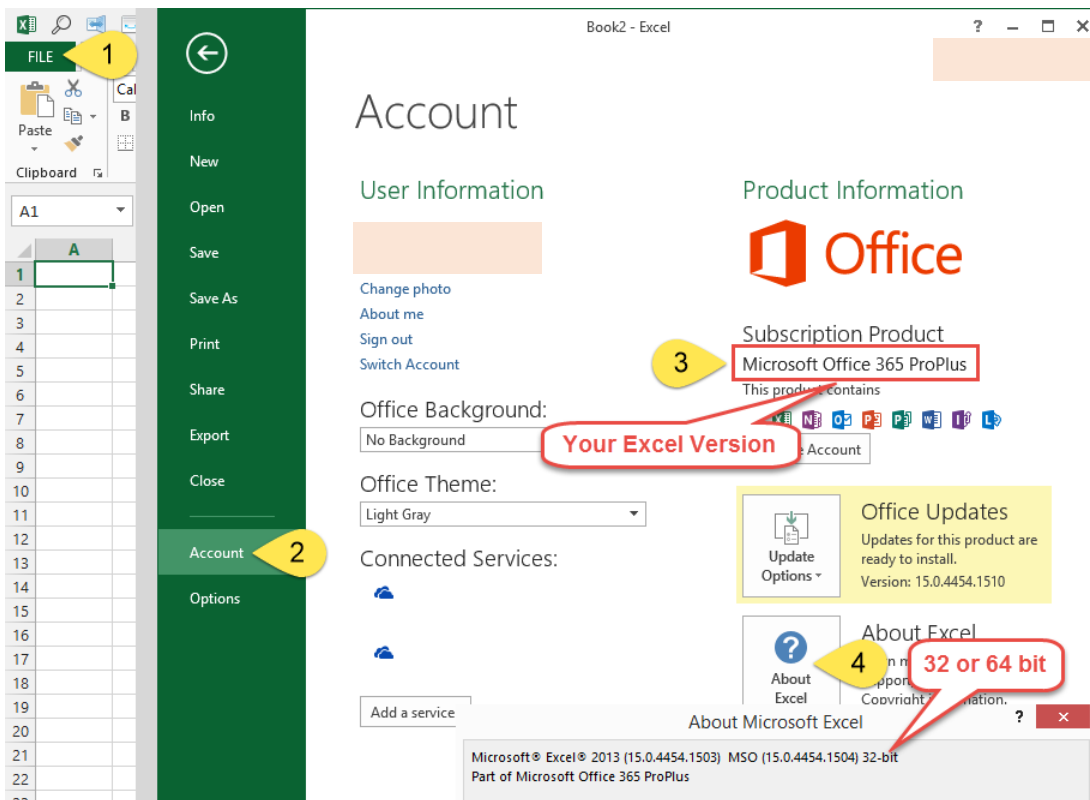
1. Click the File button
2. Click the Help option on the left side menu
3. The Excel version will be listed under the Product Activated section
4. The bit version (32-bit or 64-bit) will be listed under the About Microsoft Excel section



Excel 2013

Here's how to determine your version and 32 or 64 bits in Excel 2013:

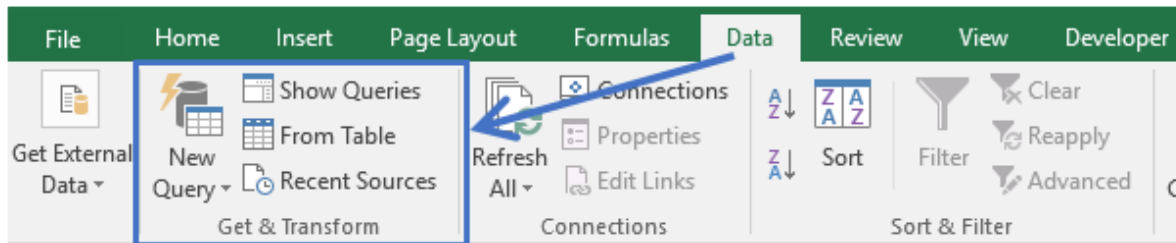
1. Click the File button.
2. Click the Account option on the left side menu.
3. The Excel version will be listed under the Subscription Product section.
4. Click the About Excel button. The bit version (32-bit or 64-bit) will be listed in the first row of the pop-up window.



Excel 2016 & Above including Office 365

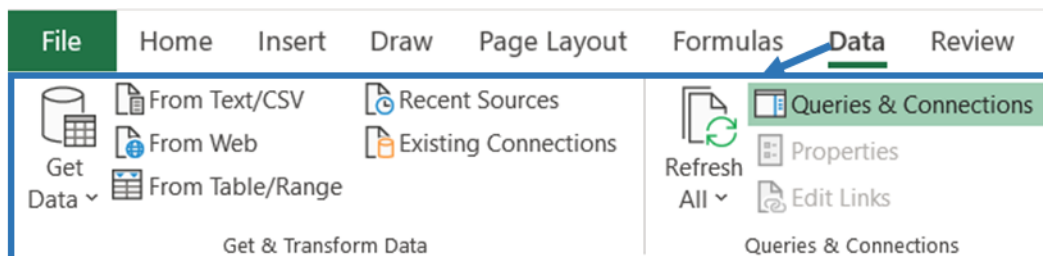
Power Query is included with Excel 2016 (Office 365). It has been renamed and is now on the Data tab of the Ribbon in the Get & Transform group. So, there is nothing to install.
